For years you've heard us talking about "finishing up the big room" so we can start doing shows in it, and at long last it's happening. A grant from Arizona Heritage Fund was matched by you - our audience, friends, and supporters - and the maple floor that was destroyed by water damage has been replaced. We are finishing up some details in the room and plan to have it open for FRANKENSTEIN'S BABY - a brand new show full of comedy and heart-warming fun. And what happens in the old room?

PUPPETS OF ASIA

Those of you who've visited in July and August have no doubt noticed the gorgeous puppets in the display cases. These are just a few of the puppets from Alan Cook's International Puppet Collection. Mr. Cook has been collecting since a boy of 12 and now has over 3000 puppets from 27 different countries, the largest private collection in America. A grant from Arizona Commission on the Arts is enabling us to bring Mr. Cook and his Asian puppets to the theater just in time for Chinese 5TH generation puppeteer Yang Huang's visit in November. Call your friends, mark your calendar, and don't miss this chance to see a Chinese master puppeteer and a historical exhibit showing the breadth of puppetry in Asia.

Mr. Cook will give a lecture on Asian puppetry on Thursday, November 4 at 7:00 p.m., followed by a demonstration of Chinese hand puppetry by Yang Haung. A \$5 donation to support the exhibit is requested for admission to the lecture/ demonstration, which is recommended for adults and teens.



Children ages 5 and up and adults will love seeing Yang Huang's MONKEY FISHING puppet show, playing at Great Arizona Puppet Theater November 3-7. Also, we are looking for volunteer docents willing to guide school groups through the Asian Puppetry Exhibit, which will be up through February 2005.
